

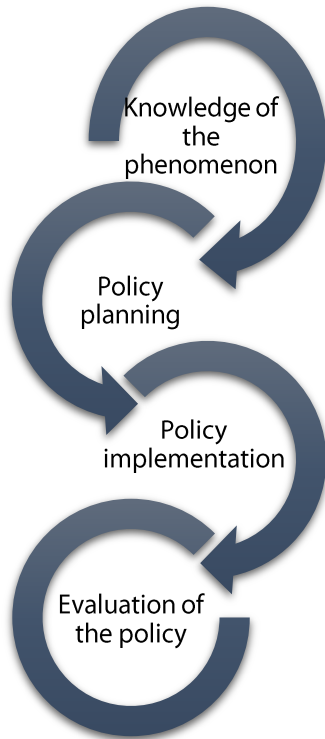

WHY IS ADMINISTRATIVE DATA IMPORTANT?



- ✓ Inform policy makers. Assess how public services respond to the needs of women who have experienced violence
 - ✓ Monitor implementation of relevant legislation and policies
 - ✓ Monitor trends over time/ between countries
 - ✓ Raise awareness
- What data should be collected?
 - ✓ How to contextualize administrative data

13 INDICATORS on intimate partner violence and rape for the POLICE and JUSTICE SECTORS

Each indicator measures annual numbers and applies to women victims and men perpetrators aged 18 +.

POLICE



- 1 Number of women **victims** of intimate partner violence
- 2 Number of intimate partner violence **offences** against women
- 3 Number of men **perpetrators** of intimate partner violence against women
- 4 Number of women victims of **physical** intimate partner violence
- 5 Number of women victims of **psychological** intimate partner violence
- 6 Number of women victims of **sexual** intimate partner violence
- 7 Number of women victims of **economic** intimate partner violence
- 8 Number of women victims of **rape**
- 9 Number of women victims of intimate partner **femicide**

JUSTICE



- 10 Number of **protection orders** issued for intimate partner violence against women
- 11 Number of men **prosecuted** for intimate partner violence against women
- 12 Number of men **sentenced** for intimate partner violence against women
- 13 Number of men **sentenced to prison** for intimate partner violence against women



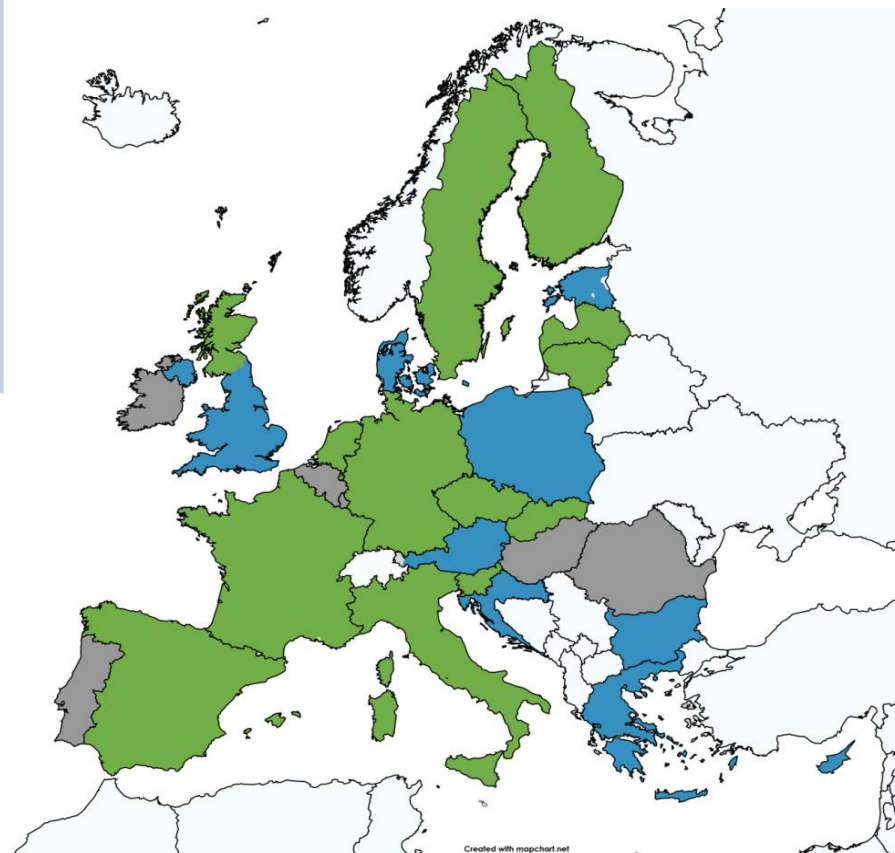
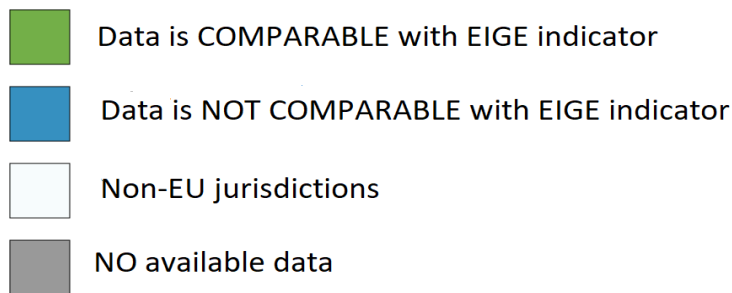

INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE DATA: CHALLENGES

Completeness

Data are quite incomplete, particularly on the indicators based on data from the justice sector. The main reasons include:

- Jurisdictions not recognising intimate partner violence as a legal offence, instead aggregating it as part of domestic violence offences;
- Jurisdictions not systematically recording data on the victims and/or the perpetrator and /or their relationship;
- National data collection systems using different unit of measurement
- No data by victim-perpetrator relationship or for characteristics of both victim and perpetrator

Comparability

The data collection on intimate partner violence chiefly consists of non-comparable data. Differences across Member States may be the result of different legal definitions, different national practices in populating data systems

The scope of definitions of intimate partner violence

Limited data on economic violence

Differences in units of measurement

Counting rules differ according to reporting requirements

Stage at which data are recorded

The scope of definitions of intimate partnership

Resource constraints

Lack of integration and coordination between systems

Gaps in disaggregation of data

Measured data are limited in scope

Data are not made available to the public
