EU policy needs

- Repeated calls of Council, European Commission and European Parliament on statistical data for combating GBV
- Convention on preventing and combating violence against women and domestic violence
- The presentation of the Commission's Directorate-General for Justice and Consumers at Eurostat's Working Group meeting on crime and criminal justice (March 2016)



EU-wide survey to collect data on GBV within European Statistical System (ESS)



Work within ESS

Partnership with national statistical authorities (MS, EEA, EFTA) and the statistical office of EU, Eurostat

Task Force (TF): to develop/improve methodology

Eurostat:


to coordinate and support the harmonised data collection

Data collection: implemented by countries

Working Group (WG): to discuss and agree the proposal of TF



Methodological support: through guidelines

Financial support: through grants



Survey development during 2017-2019

 Background study: policy needs, literature review, national and international surveys on the topic

2017

- Indicators and scope of the survey
- First draft questionnaire and pre-testing methodology
- Pre-testing (8 countries)

2018

- Improving the questionnaire and preparing pilot survey methodology
- Pilot survey (13 countries) and additional testing

2019

Improving the final questionnaire and methodology



Scope of the survey

The convention: violence that is directed against a woman because she is a woman, or violence that affects women disproportionately




- type of violence
- type and sex of perpetrator
- to limit what is possible and keep reasonable length
 - Sexual harassment at work
 - IPV: psychological, threatening, physical, sexual
 - NP: threatening, physical, sexual
 - Stalking
 - Childhood: serious physical violence by parents and sexual violence by any perpetrator


- Methodological issues:
 - planning and preparing the survey
 - interviewers selection and training
 - safety of the respondent
 - safety of the interviewers
 - conducting the fieldwork
- As a "question-answer mode"
- National examples



Guidelines: variables and questionnaire

Eurostat Description of variables for EU-GBV

2020 edition July



- Main concepts, definitions
- For each variable:
 - Link to question
 - Reporting unit/Reference period
 - Modalities/values
 - Checks/Filters
 - Description/technical issues
- Annex I: questionnaire
- Annex II: list of variables



EU survey on Gender-Based violence against women and other forms of inter-personal Violence


- Reporting the quality of the survey based on Eurostat standard guidelines, including:
 - Statistical presentation
 - Relevance
 - Accuracy and reliability
 - Timeliness and punctuality
 - Coherence and comparability



Guidelines: dissemination of the results

Eurostat Data dissemination and indicators for EU-GBV

2020 edition



- Guidelines and recommendations for publishing the results of the survey
- Initial list of indicators:
 - Type of violence
 - Frequency, severity, reporting
 - Sexual harassment at work
 - Violence in childhood
 - Awareness of support services
- For each indicator:
 - Description
 - Calculation rules
